Additionally, this is a friendly reminder that membership dues are now due. If you have not yet submitted your payment, we kindly ask that you do so at your earliest convenience.

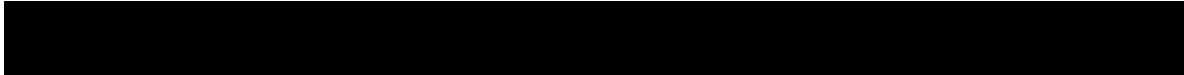

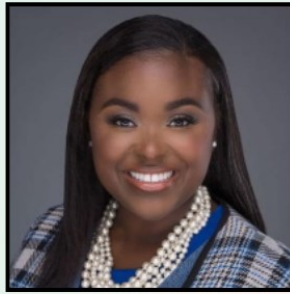

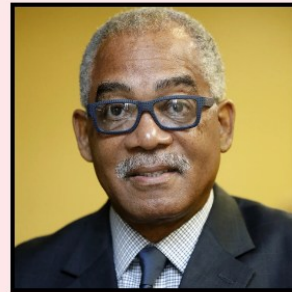
